FIRE



FIRE Data Collection underway!

FIRE is a pan-London retrospective study of infants under 3 months presenting with fever and REACH's first study! our aim is to outline variations in management and outcomes, and to examine the performance of local and national guidelines in identifying infants with serious bacterial infections.

We are very excited that R&D approval is already in place at 17 London trusts. Data collection has started across these trusts and will be running until September 2023. We anticipate including almost 2000 eligible patients in our analysis.

PEAR Study

Thank you to all trainees that took part in the PEAR Study!

PEAR (Paediatric trainee Experience in multi-site Audit and Research) is a multi-centre prospective cross-sectional study to evaluate the current level of experience in research and quality improvement work amongst London paediatric trainees. This will provide baseline information and highlight unmet training needs to guide future steps. Over a three month period we have received data from more than 145 London paediatric trainees.
